IN SCOTLAND, MACBETH, A GREAT WARRIOR, MEETS THREE WEIRD SISTERS ON THE HEATH. THEY TELL HIM THAT HE WILL BE CROWNED KING, SETTING IN MOTION A TERRIBLE CHAIN OF EVENTS. MACBETH IS THE ULTIMATE STORY OF AMBITION, MAGIC, MADNESS, AND BLOOD. IN THE WORLD OF THIS PLAY, 'FAIR IS FOUL AND FOUL IS FAIR.'

### MISSION

THE MISSION OF THE CYS YOUTH COMPANY PROGRAM IS TO BUILD COMMUNITY AMONG HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ACROSS DIVERSE BACKGROUNDS THROUGH THEIR WORK AS AN ARTISTIC ENSEMBLE. YOUTH COMPANY ACTORS REPRESENT 13 DIFFERENT COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT THE CHICAGOLAND AREA, AND A VERITABLE MELTING POT OF ETHNICITIES, CULTURES, AND LIFE EXPERIENCES. THEY ARE BROUGHT TOGETHER THROUGH THE WORKS OF WILLIAM SHAKESPEARE, WHO'S UNIVERSAL STORIES AND CHARACTERS TRANSCEND TIME AND CULTURAL BOUNDARIES.

## ON THEMES, TEENS, AND THE ARTISTIC PROCESS...

EXPLORING THE JUXTAPOSITION BETWEEN LITERAL SYMBOLS AND THE OFTEN AMBIGUOUS, ANTITHETICAL WORLD OF THE PLAY WAS THE LAUNCHING POINT FOR OUR WORK. MACBETH IS "A TALE OF BLOOD": BLOOD IS THE PRIMARY SYMBOL OF THE PLAY, AND THE MOST SPOKEN WORD IN THE TEXT. MACBETH IS ALSO A PLAY OF OPPOSITES WHERE THINGS ARE NOT WHAT THEY SEEM: "FAIR IS FOUL AND FOUL IS FAIR", "THERE'S DAGGERS IN MEN'S SMILES". THESE IDEAS WERE NOT UNFAMILIAR TO OUR HIGH SCHOOL ACTORS. NO LONGER CHILDREN, BUT NOT YET FULLY GROWN, THE LIFE OF A TEENAGER IS OFTEN AMBIGUOUS, FILLED WITH ANTITHESIS, AND OPERATES 24/7 AT A HIGH LEVEL OF INTENSITY. THROUGHOUT OUR REHEARSAL PROCESS CYS STUDENTS EXPLORED THE LITERAL VS. METAPHOR, WHILE HEIGHTENING THE ANTITHESIS FOUND IN THE LANGUAGE, IN THE ACTION OF THE PLAY, AND IN THE ARC OF THEIR CHARACTERS' STORIES.

AT CYS, PROCESS BEGINS AND ENDS WITH ENSEMBLE. WORKING COLLECTIVELY TO TAKE CREATIVE RISKS AND MAKE STRONG CHOICES ON STAGE REQUIRES A SAFE AND SUPPORTIVE CREATIVE FOUNDATION, FUELED BY COLLABORATION, INNOVATION, AND DIVERSITY OF APPROACHES AND IDEAS. WE USED A VARIETY OF TRAINING METHODS TO HELP OUR YOUNG ACTORS GET AT THE HEART OF THE TEXT, THEIR CHARACTERS, AND THE STORY. THESE METHODS INCLUDE VIEWPOINTS TRAINING WHICH DECONSTRUCTS ELEMENTS OF SPACE AND TIME, SUZUKI TO DEVELOP PRECISION, STILLNESS AND ENERGY IN THE BODY, AND EXERCISES FROM MEISNER TECHNIQUE TO HELP STUDENTS WORK OFF OF ONE ANOTHER AND REACT SPONTANEOUSLY IN THE MOMENT. THROUGHOUT THIS PROCESS WE ENCOURAGED 'PLAY' OR BEING PRESENT AND REACTIVE IN THE MOMENT, WHILE LETTING THE TEXT GUIDE US TO THE HEART OF THE STORY.
